Earn your BCIT certificate through the following program options:

Bachelor of Science in Education

Business Courses, 42 credits

Consists of coursework in Accounting, Marketing, Management, Computer Systems, Economics, Business Law, Finance, Media Arts, Communications and Statistics.

Education Courses, 58 credits

- 25 credits of coursework that emphasize foundational concepts of the Leading Teacher Program (LTP), including instruction in teaching students with special needs and English as a Second Language (ESL) students.
- 33 credits consist of your Professional Preparation, or learning how to teach BCIT courses to students in grades K-12. Professional Preparation coursework includes electronic literacy and content area reading.

University Core, 33 credits

Includes coursework in the Humanities, Social Sciences, Arts, Natural Sciences and Mathematics, explored by undergraduate students from across eight colleges at Duquesne University.

Field Experiences

Combine coursework with practice. Beginning in the second semester of your freshman year until your final semester prior to student teaching, you will be placed in local schools that provide their students with technologically advanced resources. You will gain a personal understanding of the teaching profession and apply your course content to the classroom setting.

Master of Science in Education

Students entering this program are likely to have an undergraduate degree from an education program or AACSB-accredited business program. Individuals with a business background will primarily take education courses, while students with an education background will primarily take business courses.

Education credits necessary if you have completed an ACCSB-accredited business program:

- *Entrance Track, 9 credits*
- *Diversity, 9 credits*
- *Professional Track, 9 credits*
- *Student Teaching, 6 credits*
- *Instructional Technology, 9 credits*
