CURRICULUM: An in-class program offering 11 substantive and one ethics hour of CLE credit. In Belfast, attendees will receive instruction in Human Rights Law. In Dublin, attendees will study Law of the European Union, International Arbitration and Dispute Resolution, and International Contracts for the Sale of Goods: Comparisons.

This program has been approved by the Pennsylvania Continuing Legal Education Board for eleven (11) hours of substantive law, practice, and procedure CLE credit and one (1) hour of ethics, professionalism or substance abuse CLE credit.

CLASS SCHEDULE: Classes will be taught by Irish and American faculty members and will meet on June 7 and June 11–13. In Belfast, classes will meet at Queen’s University; in Dublin, classes will meet at University College Dublin, Ireland’s largest university.

June 12, 9:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- **International Arbitration and Dispute Resolution** (3 substantive credits)
June 13, 9:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

SITE VISITS: In addition to the classroom program, an opening dinner and a number of professional and cultural excursions are being planned. In and around Belfast, these include: 1) meeting with **Danny Morrison**, the former publicity director of Sinn Fein; 2) a daylong tour of the North Coast with visits to **Dunluce Castle**, the **Giant’s Causeway**, and the **Carrick-a-rede Rope Bridge**; and 3) a visit to **Armagh**, the Ecclesiastical Capital City.

In Dublin these include an optional hike around the **Howth Peninsula** and a visit to the **Ambassador’s residence**.

ACCOMMODATIONS: The Eucharistic Congress is meeting in Dublin, June 10–17; therefore, accommodations are extremely limited and early registration is strongly encouraged.

In Belfast, a limited number of rooms have been secured at the Marine Guesthouse (www.marineguesthouse3star.com/) (at approximately \$70–\$95 USD, per night, breakfast included) and at Dukes at Queens Boutique Hotel (www.dukesatqueens.com) (for approximately \$100 USD per night, including breakfast).

In Dublin, a limited number of rooms have been secured at Premier Suites, Dublin (www.premiersuitesdublin.com) and Premier Apartments Dublin Sandyford (www.premierapartmentssandyford.com). The approximate cost for these rooms is \$250 USD per night. Accommodations may also be available at University College Dublin in six-bedroom apartments at a rate of \$39 USD per night per person.

Other accommodations may be obtained by attendees on an individual basis through their travel agents.

Spouses and children are welcome.

COSTS AND PAYMENT DEADLINES: Travel costs to and from Ireland and all other costs and expenses not specifically mentioned are not included. Fares vary widely. We suggest you consult a travel agent and request the lowest available fare from any carrier.

Tuition – \$740

- Tuition is due by April 2, 2012, and *must be payable in U.S. dollars to Duquesne University.*
- The tuition cost includes the cost of the 12 CLE credits, the Danny Morrison lecture, a welcome dinner at Belfast Castle, transportation between Belfast and Dublin on June 9 (including the visit to the Ecclesiastical Capital City Armagh) and the trip to the Ambassador’s residence.

Housing – ASAP, but no later than April 2, 2012, and the amount varies based on the location.

Optional tour of the North Coast – \$75

- Due by April 2, 2012. Includes transportation and entry to sites.

Non-CLE travel companions – \$150

- Due by April 2, 2012. Tours and fees included; but a separate application is required.

TRAVEL: All participants must have a valid passport.

Participants are responsible for making their own travel arrangements to and from Ireland.

Duquesne University will not be responsible for any personal injury, property damage or illness encountered by any participants during the program. All participants are advised to purchase appropriate medical, accidental and travel insurance.

CANCELLATION: Duquesne University reserves the right to cancel the program due to insufficient enrollment or other extraordinary emergency conditions. In the event of cancellation, tuition will be refunded.
