

Executive Coaching in Context

Offered through the Duquesne University School of Business Professional Coach Certification Program (PCCP and taught by PCCP co-founder Michael Forlenza, PhD, MPH, PCC.)



This elective course is for students that have completed an ACTP Accredited program, with a minimum of 125 hours of coach training. We will consider the special and unique contexts and challenges faced by coaches who are working with leaders and executives in organizations. While the foundation of coaching remains the same, this course is designed to address the unique needs and perspectives of executives and leaders. In addition, participants will learn about contracting with organizations, developing and building relationships with organizations and sponsors, and establishing a professional presence.

Major Topics

This course follows the Duquesne Coaching Model: Context, Discovery, Possibilities, Action and Expansion. We will address a number of relevant topics including: principles of executive coaching and guidelines for practice; working with sponsors; establishing clear boundaries between clients and sponsors; leadership stress and development; establishing vision, directions & goals; contracting with clients; tying coaching to organizational strategy, ethical considerations; and considerations of your coaching approach and business.
