

CERTIFICATE IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

The Certificate in International Business is a credential for any globally-focused Duquesne student who wishes to complement their major with practical value-added competencies in IB. The certificate requires students to complete:

Five business courses (15 credits), although the actual number of additional courses required for the certificate will vary depending on the student's major and school within Duquesne, as described below, and a study abroad experience.

Approved programs include:

- 1. DU programs in Rome and Dublin or
- 2. DU-approved study abroad programs offered through third-party providers.
- 3. DU Spring Breakaway

The certificate includes opportunities to combine a course requirement and the study abroad requirement, as noted below.

COURSES IN THE 15-CR IB CERTIFICATE

TWO REQUIRED COURSES:

- MGMT 262: Global Insights (a business core class)
 Can be combined with study abroad: MGMT 262 also is offered at the Rome campus during the fall semester.
