Master of Health Management Systems – 30 Credits

The Master of Health Management Systems program allows students to integrate the areas of healthcare, business management, and information systems into a dynamic skill set that positions them to become inventors, innovators, and entrepreneurs in the ever-evolving healthcare market. Graduates are prepared to recognize and understand health care trends, develop and articulate solutions, and make meaningful differences in the healthcare industry.

Expertise in the health management allows our graduates to communicate effectively with medical and health professionals while also appreciating and considering the needs of the patients.
