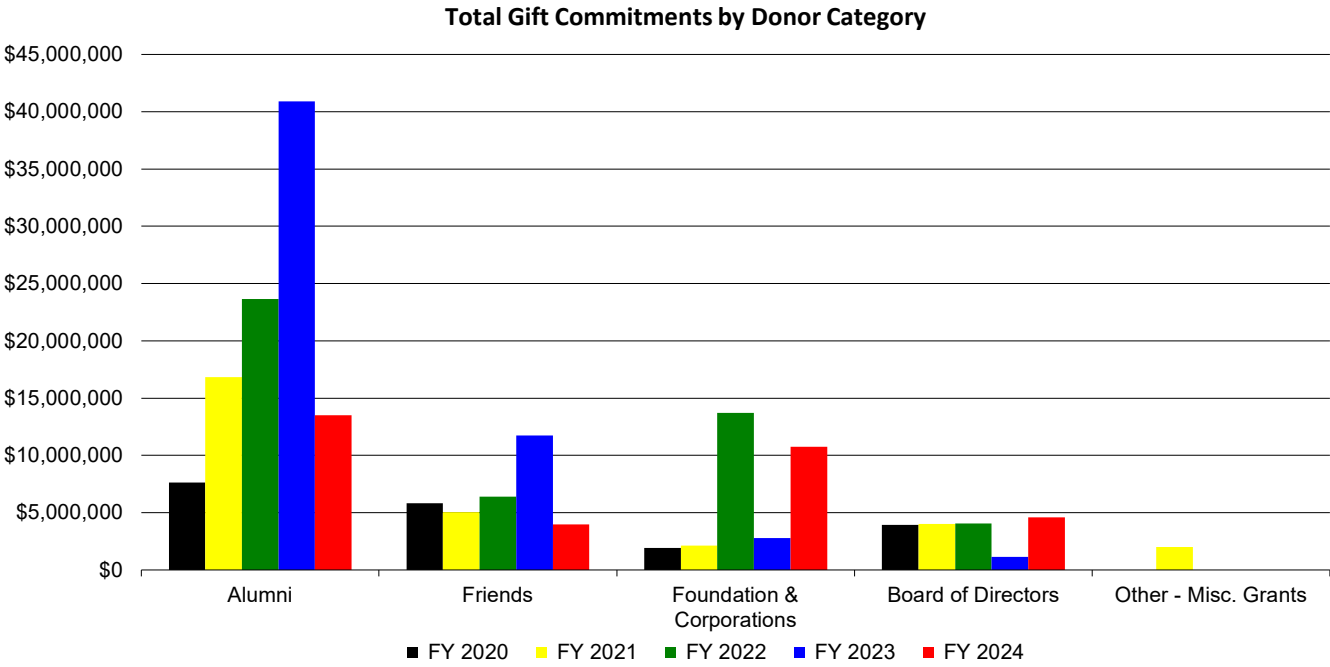

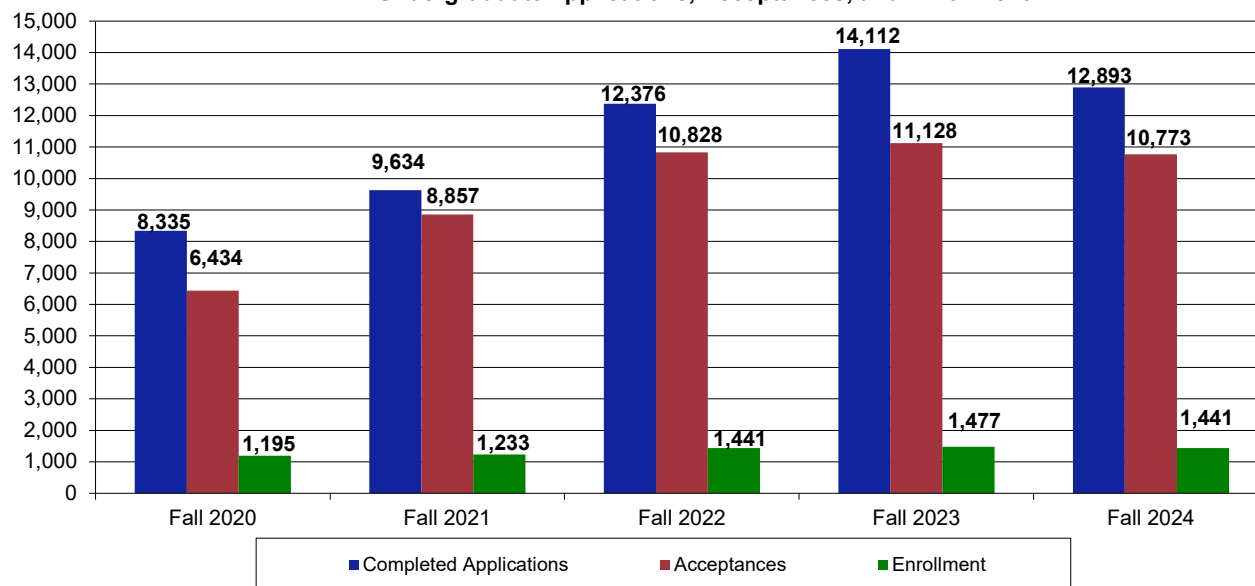

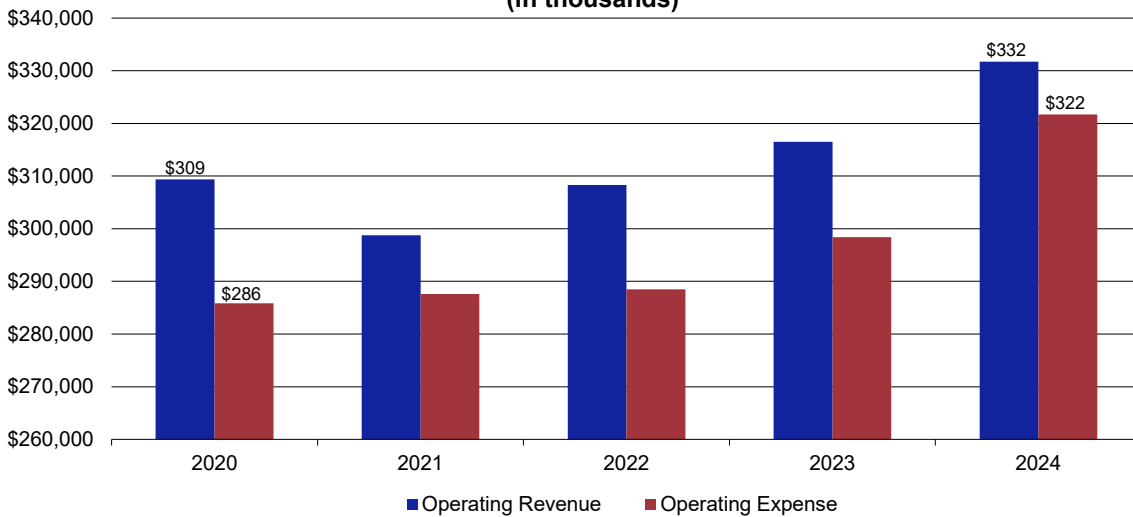

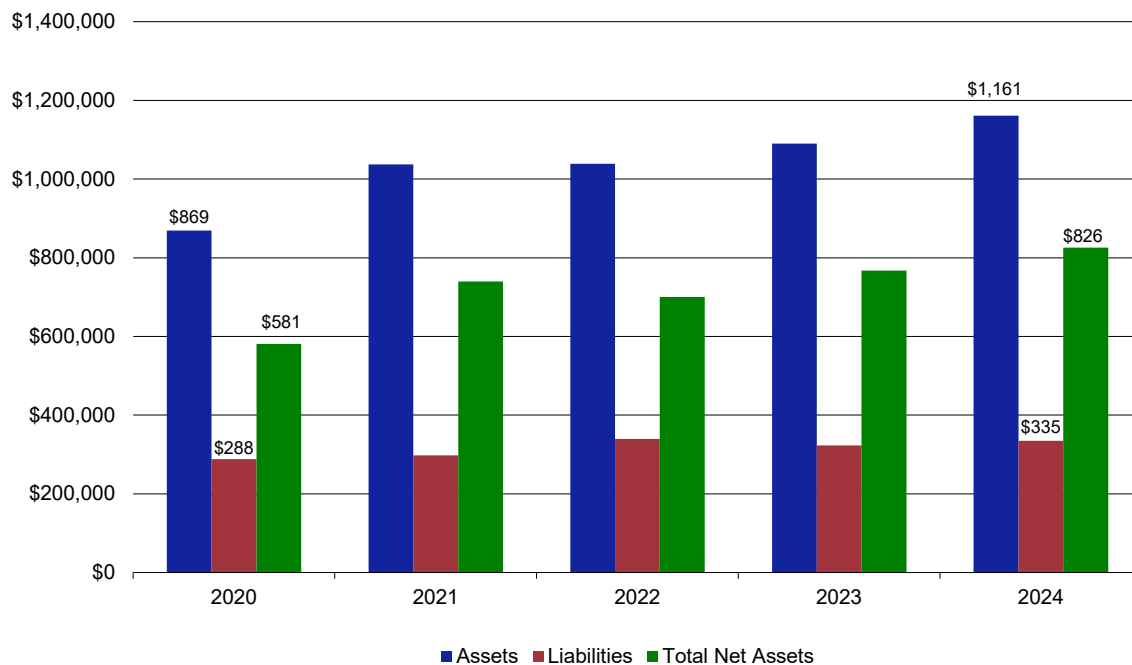

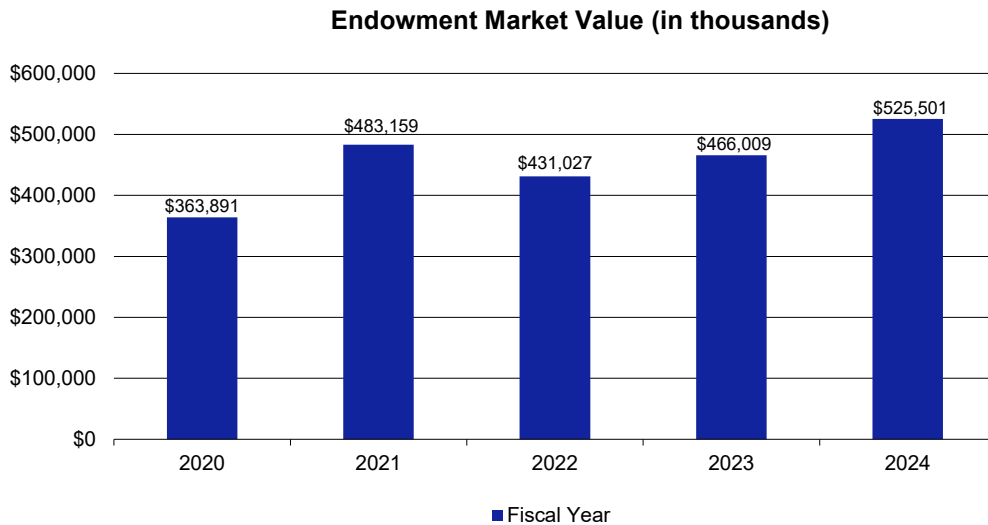
**Summary of Financial Position**
